What is Summit of the Future?

- Why? To create a global roadmap for future cooperation and strengthen the global multilateral system for generations to come.
- Key Themes:
 - Climate action and environmental sustainability
 - Peace and conflict resolution
 - Strengthening multilateralism and global governance
 - Accelerating progress on the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
 - Innovation in technology, digital transformation, and future of work



Key insights

Education is a low priority at the summit

- We must refocus the conversation on a future where education is the foundation for sustainable development, peace, and inclusive growth.
- Education is only mentioned nine times in the Pact, and not as having a value in itself.

Limited Civil Society engagement

- Current Context: MGoS has been working on increasing civil society involvement, but it remains challenging.
- Challenges: The space for civil society voices is often overshadowed by geopolitical tensions, and civil society is frequently considered an afterthought in policy discussions.
